### DESCRIPTION

The San José Galleon, one of the most important ships built in colonial times, sank after fighting an English fleet off the coast of Cartagena de Indias in 1708.

The Colombian government announced the discovery of the shipwreck in December 2015, after 307 years of searching. The submerged treasure still keeps 90% of the original load, about 600 cubic meters of wealth. The entire shipwreck site is considered as Colombian cultural heritage.

Through the National Agency for Legal Defense of the State, a consensus was reached with the litigating countries that, as long as the treasure remains in the city of Cartagena, Colombia's ownership of the treasure will not be disputed. National and Local Authorities are fully committed to finding a key partner that studies and implements the best possible value enhancement strategy through the creation of a venue or experience that can have a great impact on Cartagena as a global destination.
