DESCRIPTION

The city's main market square, Bazurto, is located in an old and worn out building. Over the years, the surrounding public space has been invaded by street vendors. The project seeks to build four new market squares to relocate the Bazurto's merchants.

The project has three main goals, the relocation of the main market square, development of satellite smaller markets, and the recovery of the invaded public space. The new market square will have proper garbage collections and recycling systems as well as infrastructure for water supply, sewerage, and electricity. The project seeks to integrate the new square with other public satellite markets such as the "Mercado de Santa Rita" and build another 3 in different parts of the city. The market network will be strengthened with the formalization process of the Bazurto's merchants and the maintenance of an optimal level of hygiene, health, and safety.
